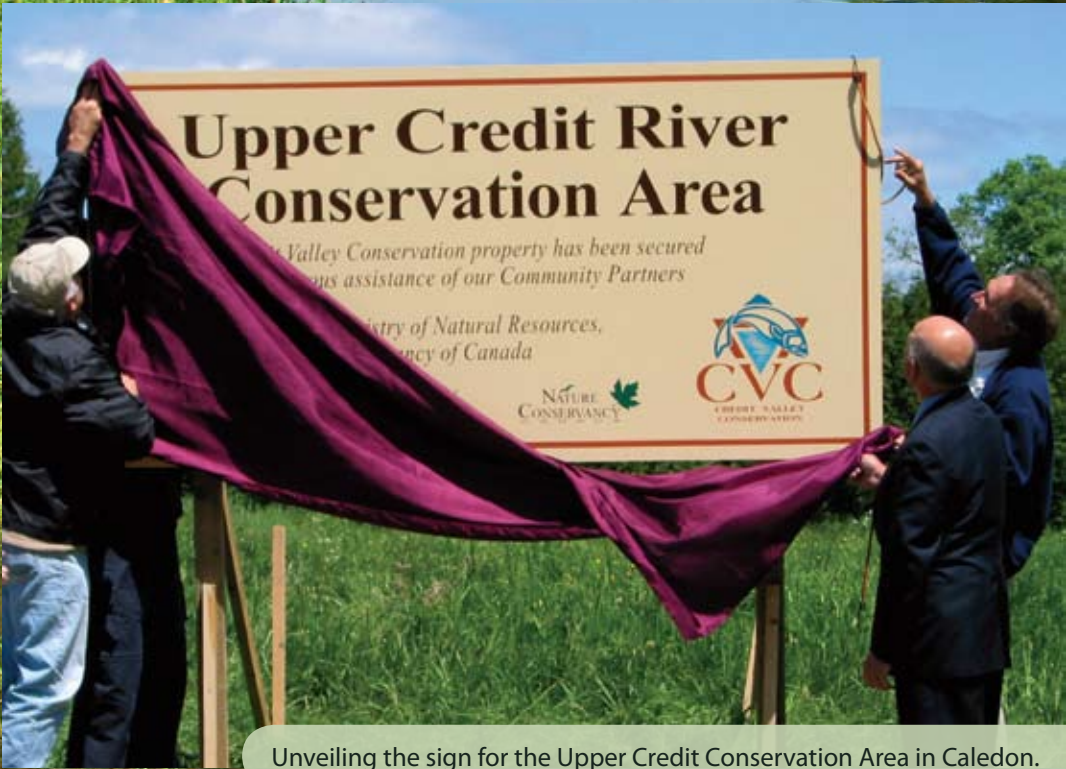

Success Stories

In 2005, CVC partnered with the Region of Peel, the Ministry of Natural Resources, and the Nature Conservancy of Canada through an Ontario Greenlands grant, to secure a 32 hectare (80 acre) jewel of land in the Town of Caledon featuring more than 1 kilometre of the Credit River and 5 hectares (14 acres) of Provincially Significant Wetland. On opening day of June 2006, over 150 community residents and partners came out to help celebrate with tree plantings and nature hikes. Purchased from Hannelore and Michel Safari, long-time participants in local stewardship programs, the Conservation Area will become a prime location for hiking, picnicking and fishing.
